

We provide eco-friendly and sustainable environment in the campus and try to imbibe core values and culture so that students become good human beings and citizens. Development of Skill amongst the student irrespective of gender has been one of our priority areas. Besides offering conventional Arts, and Commerce education and B. Voc programmes we also offer vocational and job-oriented Certificate and Add-on courses. Located in the rural Darrang District, we have been able to have a good infrastructure in the campus with digital smart classroom room, one video conferencing room, well equipped geography laboratory, education laboratory, computer laboratory and language laboratory. We have several classrooms with ICT facilities to make the classroom environment more interesting and interactive. Our library is fully computerized with COHA Web-OPAC facility. We provide unlimited internet connectivity to the faculty. There is a well-equipped and furnished Girls' Hostel in the campus. We have installed a 40 Kw solar power plant in the campus and thus turned ourselves from consumer to a producer and supplier of Green energy. We have well equipped Gymnasium and Fitness, Yoga Centre, Indoor stadium with Badminton court and Table Tennis boards and Play ground with Volleyball court. The Institution being a co-educational institution has focused on women empowerment too. Through the NSS, Career Counseling and Guidance Cell and women Cell we have organized a number of workshops to impart the life skill and training programmes for physical, preparation for competitive examinations (civil and defense service) for both the boys and girl students. As a result, of that the number of participation of students in general and the participation of the girl students in particular, are observed increasing over the years and some of them (including the girl students) have got the placement in the Defence Departments.

Another priority area of the institution is the maintenance of regularity, discipline, punctuality. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College takes care in improving quality and suggests measures for overall development of the College. Grievance Redressal Cell, Anti Raging Committee and the Internal Complain Committee are very active in follow up any issues that come under the per view of the breach of rules

and regulations. Apart from NAAC re-accreditation in 2015 with B'Grade (CGPA of 2.30), our College has also participated in the NIRF recently. During the COVID 19 pandemic, we introduced online classes and we are continuing with it in a blended mode with classroom teaching as and when required. Faculties have also uploaded study materials and Class videos and audios in the college portal for the benefit of the students. Initiatives have also been taken to sign for collaborations and MoUs with Institutions/NGOs and jointly undertaking various activities/initiatives. Thus, we are trying to our level best to provide the best of facilities and quality education to our students within the available resources that may be expected in a Higher Educational Institute.

PROFILE:

Kharupetia College is one of the premier institutions of higher education in Darrang District. The College saw the light of day as a result of untiring efforts of the far- sighted people of greater Kharupetia locality. Established in the year 1981, the college was taken over by the Govt. of Assam under deficit system of grants-in-aid w.e.f. 25/03/98. The college was provincialised by the Govt. of Assam w.e.f. 01/12/2005 vide Govt. notification No. LPG. 112/2005/158 dated the 19th December, 2005. The College has been included under section 2(f) & 12 (B) of the UGC act, 1956.

Affiliated to Gauhati University, the college has been assessed and accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in cycle 2 in October, 2015 and awarded Grade B. The college is imparting education for Higher Secondary in two streams: Arts and Commerce and Degree Programmes in Three streams/disciplines Arts, Commerce and B.Voc. The college has adopted Four Year Undergraduate Progreamme (FYUGP) under NEP 2020 for Arts, Commerce and B.Voc programmes under Gauhati University from 2023-24 onwards. The college has been maintaining excellent records of performance in different University and Council Examinations.

LOCATION:

Kharupetia College is situated at Bologarah under Shyamabari Mouza about 1 k.m. west from Kharupetia Town under Mangaldai sub-division. It is about 15 k.m. away from Mangaldai, the District head quarters of Darrang and is connected by the N.H. 15.

Vision


Accordingly, a student must pass the H.S. First year examination for promotion to second year or final year.

INTRODUCTION TO FYUGP


The FYUGP at Kharupetia College is designed by Gauhati University to offer two types of Bachelor's Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme:

- I) Bachelor's Degree in a Stream and (ii) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline. The word stream here refers to Arts and Commerce. In case of a degree in a discipline, the student can take Vocational (B. Voc.) course. For both the types of degree programmes, the whole FYUGP is divided into two parts-
 - Core Courses and
 - Common Courses.

The minimum credit allocation for a 3-year programme is 84 credits in Core Courses and 36 credits in Common Courses, which comes to a total of minimum 120 credits for a 3-year programme. With the fourth year, the minimum credit requirements become 160. A student can however earn up to a maximum of 132 credits in a 3-year programme and 176 by the fourth year. The details of curricula, courses and structures, under FYUGP available at Kharupetia College are shown below:

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Kharupetia College has its Admission Committee constituted with teachers of various departments of the College which finalizes the matter relating to admission. A candidate seeking admission to the college in the H.S / T.D.C. classes must apply through 'DARPAN' (for H.S. Classes) / 'e-SAMARTH' (for GU Courses) online mode. Students must upload documents as per required in the portal. After verification, selected candidates will be informed through their registered mobile numbers.

A candidate will be admitted strictly on the basis of merit.

A candidate must produce the following documents at the time of admission:

- (I) Original Mark sheet and Admit card of the qualifying examination. Laminated mark sheet will not be entertained/ accepted for free admission.
 - (ii) Original pass certificate of the qualifying examination
 - (iii) Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
 - (iv) Registration Certificate (SEBA/AHSEC).
 - (v) Photo copy of HSLC/HS Marksheet.
 - (vi) Caste Certificate in case of SC/ST/OBC/MOBC candidates.
- (vii) Students who passed HSLC / HS Examination earlier than 2021 must produce Gap Certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.
 - (viii) EWS Certificate.
 - (ix) Differently Able Certificate.

Add-on courses will be provided by various departments of Kharupetia College subject to approval of the Academic Committee, Kharupetia College. Details of these courses will be announced in due course of time by the respective departments.

SOCIO- ECONOMIC STUDY CENTRE:

A Socio-Economic study centre was set up by the department of Economics in 2004 with a vision to initiate research activities amongst the students and teachers. The centre tries to find out the factors responsible for poor socio-economic condition of the people of this region through Socio -Economic surveys and thereby to furnish the reports of the surveys with probable suggestions and remedies.

The department of Economics publishes an annual journal named 'Economica'

CENTRE FOR INDIAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEM

Kharupetia College has established a centre for Indian Knowledge System (IKS) in the year 2023. The aim of the centre is to promote, preserve and disseminate "Indian Knowledge Systems" for practical and societal applications.

AWARDS

With a view to ensuring quality improvement, the following awards/ incentives were introduced by various departments from the academic session 2003-04.

- (i) Best Student of the year Award: A cash award of Rs. 1000/- (one thousand) only will be given to the student securing highest Grade Point (CGPA) in the Major Subject in the B.A. / B. Com. Final Semester Examination.
- (ii) Cash award of Rs. 1000/ (Rupees one thousand) each will be given to the students securing highest CGPA in each Major subject in the B.A. Final Examination. If there is no Major student in a particular subject the award will go to the sutdent securing highest Marks / CGPA in that subject offered as general subject. These awards will be sponsored by the respective Departments of the College.
- (iii) Late Abdul Wahab Talukdar Memorial cash award of Rs. 1000/- (Rupees one thousand) will be given to the student securing highest aggregate marks (minimum 75%) in H.S. Final Examination.
- (iv) Late Hazi Maju Sheikh and Late Abdus Samad Memorial cash incentive of Rs. 1000/-(Rupees one thousand) will be given to ten students offering Mathematics as a general subject in T.D.C. Classes. The beneficiaries of these incentives will be selected on the basis of a qualifying test to be held by the Deptt. of Mathematics. These Cash incentives will be sponsored by Abdur Rahman, Associate Professor, Deptt. Of Mathematics.
- (v) From the academic session 2013-14 an award entitled the 'Best Library User Award' has been introduced by the Librarian. The award is given to the student who follows the Library rules and regulations like discipline, regularity, time consumed in library etc.

 - (ii) Free Admission will be given to outstanding sports person having records of representing in State Level Competitions.

COLLEGE UNIFORM

College Uniform is Compulsory for all students:

Uniform for Boys: Black Colour Long Pant (Jeans are not allowed), Cream Colour Full Shirt with black

footwears & Maroon Coloured sweater.

Uniform for Girls: Cream Colour Kameez, Black Colour Patiwala Salwar-Pyjama (Slacks are not allowed),

Black Colour Dupatta, Black footwear & Maroon Coloured Sweater.

ATTENDANCE:

Attendance in classes is compulsory. 20% of weightage of sessional examination will be given to class attendence. Students failing to attend at least 75% of the classes held will be treated as non-collegiate and those failing to attend 60% of the classes will not be allowed to appear in the Final Examination.

GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE:

The students admitted to this college are expected to maintain high degree of discipline. They must abide by all the rules and regulations as laid down by the college authorities. Violation of those rules, non clearance of college fees, showing discourtesy to the teachers and members of staff in any form, adoption of unfair means in the examination, indulging in ragging, etc. are some of the offences which may lead to disciplinary action like suspension, forced transfer or even expulsion from the college.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR:

The Academic Calendar of the College is prepared by the IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell) of the College in accordance with the Academic Calendar of Gauhati University. Different academic and co-curricular activities of the college are carried on according to this calendar as far as practicable.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE:

A college magazine named Kharupetia College Magazine is published annually with a view to giving scope for expression of the literary and creative talents of the students and teachers of the college. Besides this, a few wall magazines are also brought out regularly.

COLLEGE LIBRARY:

The College has a digitalized library with a collection of nearly 28000(Twenty eight thousand) books including text books, 21 periodicals and 13 news papers with regional, national and international repute. The library has been providing Book Bank facility to the meritorious BPL and Divyang students. The library is automated by using SOUL software. OPAC and Barcode system are being introduced for smooth running of regular library services. Moreover, the college (library) is registeted under N-LIST (of INFLIBNET Centre) and also National Digital Library of India (NDLI) for consulting e-resources. The library has provided time bound internet browsing facility to the users for academic purpose only. The College Library is for the use of the students, Teachers and the employees of the College. The facilities for borrowing of books by the users are available subject to the observance of Library Rules. Besides the Central Library, Departmental Libraries have also been set up to cater to the need of the aspiring users.

LANGUAGE LABORATORY

A well-equipped Language Laboratory funded by RUSA 1.0 (2018) has been set up at Kharupetia College. Until the Covid-19 Pandemic only Spoken English Certificate Course was offered through the Laboratory. However initiatives are being taken to offer Spoken Arabic, French and other foreign language Courses through the said Language Laboratory from the academic session 2024-25.

STUDENTS' UNION:

Kharupetia college students' Union is the General Body of the students of the college. All the regular students of the college are the members of this Union. The President, the General Secretary and other office bearers of the Students' Union are elected by the students annually. The Principal reserves the right to dissolve the Union Body at any time on disciplinary ground and constitute an ad-hoc body till fresh elections are held.

EXAMINATION:

The college authority strictly adheres to college examinations and promotion rules. Apart from the Final Examinations to be conducted by the AHSEC / Gauhati University, every student of H.S. 1st year, H.S 2nd year and TDC Classes will have to appear in two sessional Examinations.

Appearance in these examinations is compulsory failing which a student will not be allowed to sit for the final examinations.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

For all round development of the students, the College provides adequate facilities for various cocurricular activities like indoor and outdoor games, debate and symposium, cultural programmes etc. Moreover, lectures and seminars on various topics are also organized regularly.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS) :


