

Part II Analysis

Preface

Kharupetia College is one of the important institutions of higher education in Darrang district. The college was established in the year 1981 by some far-sighted local people with the aim of dissemination of higher education in this socially and economically backward region. The college was taken over by the Govt. of Assam under deficit system of Grant-in-Aid w.e.f. 25 - 3 - 1998. Kharupetia College is affiliated to Gauhati University which has affiliation to the Association of Indian Universities.

The college is situated at a distance of about 17 Km. from District Head Quarters and 1 Km. from Kharupetia (a semi-urban centre). It is encircled by 6 (six) Mauzas i.e. i) Kharupetia, ii) Shyamabari, iii) Pub Dalgaon, iv) Paschim Dalgaon, v) Pub Sialmari and vi) Paschim Sialmari. The college has 48 bighas of land area (30 bighas allotted, 18 bighas under possession) besides two big fisheries.

The institution has grown slowly to have at present 12 departments in undergraduate level having Major (Honours) facilities in eight departments (Political science, Education, History, English, Assamese, Economics, Arabic and Philosophy). There are about 600 students on its roll with 38 teachers and 18 non-teaching staff (including the librarian). The institution is yet to receive any financial grants from the UGC.

The whole infrastructural development of the institution depends on the revenues earned by way of fees and other means, donations received from the public, the teaching and non-teaching staff. Area development funds of the M.L.A. and M.P.s have also contributed to its growth. Despite facing many problems in the way of growth, the institution is making effort to impart quality education and helping the community of this backward region to get the fruits of civilization. The institution has made preparation to assess its strength and weaknesses to keep pace with the changing scenario of the 21st century. The institution desires to play a positive role in this context. The institution has decided to approach NAAC to get itself assessed and accredited, so that, it can put itself on the path

of continuous quality improvement in academic and administrative activities. As per guidelines of the NAAC, the institution formed a steering committee consisting of 12 (Twelve) members under the co-ordinatorship of Sri Deepak Kalita, Head, Department of Economics to prepare Self Study Report and analyse its strengths and weaknesses (SWOT analysis is enclosed as Annexure- XVIII). The whole responsibility of data collection and preparing the documents lies with the steering committee. Our perception of strengths and weaknesses (Criterion-wise) are as follows.

CURRICULAR ASPECTS: 1.

Kharupetia college is an affiliated college under Gauhati University, Assam. Being an affiliated college our institution follows the syllabi prescribed by the University for Arts Stream at the under graduate level. The institution offers 12 (twelve) programmes in U.G. level. Moreover, the college imparts education at (+2) stage as a community service for which no additional posts are sanctioned. Almost all the programmes are conventional in nature.

The institution has taken initiative in ,providing computer knowledge to the students by opening computer centre in the campus with the help of C-DAC (An agency of computer education). The institution is yet to introduce relevant, inter-disciplinary and need based courses. Since the institution is situated in agriculture based area, it has the scope to initiate efforts to exploit the advantage of introducing vocational courses having relevance to agricultural needs of the area and the state as a whole.

It takes two years to introduce a new programme within the regulations of the Present University system. Since the institution functions under an affiliating system, it does Not enjoy freedom to introduce innovations such as modular curriculum. Of course, the students can avail several options in selecting their Major (Honours) and Elective subjects Within the discipline. The curriculum of Gauhati University does not provide opportunities for field work/ practical works in humanities. There is no provision for internal assessment in the evaluation process in the Arts stream. 104

TEACHING, LEARNING AND EVALUATION. CRITERION II:

Kharupetia College plays a pivotal role in spreading up higher education in this backward area. Students from remote area come to have education despite facing many problems. Admission is made on the basis of merit. It is observed that most of the students are drawn from the Higher Secondary Schools of the same district.

Besides lecture method of teaching, the institution encourages the students to follow "learning by doing" method. Students take part in seminars, group discussions etc. There is also provision for giving home assignments, laboratory work. Teachers prepare a teaching plan in the beginning of the academic session (A format of teaching plan is enclosed as Annexure XIX). The syllabi are unitised according to the teaching plan. The students are made aware of the evaluation methods in the beginning of the year through the college prospectus which is published and updated annually (propectus of the college is enclosed as Annexure XX). Periodic Unit Tests have enabled the institution to monitor the overall performance of the students. The teachers are appointed as per UGC. norms by inviting applications through the leading news papers of the state. The institution has the freedom to appoint and pay the non-sanctioned and temporary staffs. Although the institution does not conduct refresher courses on its own, it encourages the teachers for faculty development by allowing them to participate in refresher course/ orientation course conducted by different Indian Universities under the UGC. The college follows the self appraisal method to evaluate the performance of the teachers. Students feedback on the teachers performance and the campus experience help the teachers to identify their Weaknesses, if any, and improve their standard by rectifying it (enclosed a format of self-appraisal as Annexure XXI). The college has made provision for tutorial classes, but the number of such tutorial classes are not sufficient. The teacher of the institution are involved in guiding the students outside the classroom, spending considerable time with them. The institution does not have national and international linkages. The learning process of the institution gets disturbed to some extent due to frequent "Bandh" calls given by Various political and non-political organisations from time to time.

RESEARCH CONSULTANCY AND EXTENSION. CRITERION III:

As an affiliated college, the institution does not enjoy the status of a research institution. Hence this institution is not in a position to guide Ph. D. students or to award Ph.D. degrees. At present four lecturers of the college are involved in research activities and Govt. registered as part time research scholars under Gauhati University, Assam and North-East Hill University, Meghalaya.

The college has an extension education cell which undertakes various extension activities. The teachers and students extend active co-operation to the cell in this respect. Free Health check-up Camps are organised from time to time. Plantation programme, cleaniiness drive etc. are organised at the initiative of the extension education cell. The institution hopes to put more effort in extension activities in collaboration with local N.G.O.s and G.O.s in future. The institution does not have the units of N.C.C. & N.S.S. In absence of these organisations, the institution faces some problems in undertaking the developmental programmes. Of course, at present initiative has been taken to overcome these difficulties by applying for opening branches of N.S.S., N.C.C. and Scout & Guide in the institution.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES. CRITERION IV :

Situated on a sprawling campus of 48 bighas of land, the institution has a moderate infrastructure to meet the requirements of academic and co-curricular activities. The institution enjoys the privilege of having a calm and quiet atmosphere which is essential for carrying out teaching-learning activities. The institution was recently brought under the deficit system of Grant-in-Aid (1998). The institution is yet to receive grants from the UGC. or Government to develop its infrastructure. It is not adequate to meet the requirements of the students. A separate building has been constructed for the computer centre. The master plan has been prepared to show the vision of the institution for the future expansion. It must be admitted that the library facilities of our institution are not adequate. The central library has only 3510 books. Number of journals and magazines are not adequate to meet

the requirements of teaching staff and the students. The departmental libraries also have limited number of books. Paucity of fund has been the major hindrance in purchasing books/ subscribing journals for the library. Of course, efforts are on to improve the dismal conditions of the library. The library is opened from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M. for students. The college premises are made available for holding Hindi examinations of Assam Rastrabhasha Prasar Samity. Besides, local N.G.O.s / Societies are also allowed to use the college building for holding meetings, seminars, cultural programme etc. The institution has tied up with a computer agency and provided accommodation to it for opening up the computer centre in the campus for imparting computer education to the students, teachers and as well as to the public.

The college has a health centre where first aid facilities are available. A doctor has been appointed by the Governing Body of the college to conduct periodic health check up of students. Hostel facilities for the students are not available. There are no quarters for the Principal, teaching staff and the employees of the institution in the campus. The infrastructure for sports and cultural activities are moderate. One out door play ground, two traditional swimming pool and various outdoor and indoor sports materials are available for the students. The college provides special incentives in the form of free admission to outstanding sports persons showing excellence in the district level and above. One of the unique achievements of the college is that our students bagged two Gold medals in the Youth festival organised by Gauhati University in the year 2003. The college team was adjudged the best team in Drama competition and best actor award was also won by our student.

CRITERION - V: STUDENTS SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION.

The college has been extending all the needed support for better performance of the students. This is evident from the result of T.D.C. Part-I and Part-II examinations. Two of our students got 1st class in the subject of Education in the year 2002. It may be mentioned that most of the students are not meritorious at their entry point but they exhibit considerable improvement in performance in the final examinations. This improvement in

107

the performance is largely due to the efforts on the part of the committed teachers of the institution. The enrolment rates are moderate. The drop out rates are high. It is due to the socio-economic backwardness of the locality. Most of the students have to forego their education in the midway due to their financial problems. Besides the pecuniary problems of the students early marriage (during the under graduate level) is considered one of the main hindrances for the girl students to continue their education. Another factor responsible for the high drop out rate is that there are two final examinations in the under graduate level under Gauhati University. Unsuccessful students of the Part-I examination are included in the dropped out candidates in the Part-II examination as they can not appear in the Part-II examination. These make the drop out rates high in the final analysis.

The Alumni Association of the institution was formed on 13th September, 2003. Alumni Association is expected to play an effective role in the growth of the institution. The college does not have any employment cell but it has an Information and Career Counselling Cell, through which students are provided information about various career and employment opportunities. Several awards have been instituted to motivate the students academically. There is provision for extending financial assistance to the needy and deserving students. Teachers provide personal counselling to the aspiring students. Students enjoy annual sports, cultural programmes in the college week and the authority also encourages the students to participate in the various competitions held in the surrounding areas. Remedial teaching is provided to the students who are weak in certain subjects to improve their performance. Unit Tests are held to ensure regular monitoring of the students performance even though that is not imposed by the University.

ORGANISATION AND MANAGEMENT. CRITERION - VI :

The college is managed by a Governing body constituted by the Director of Higher Education, Assam in accordance with Assam Non-Government College Management Rules, 2001 (enclosed as Annexure XXII). The routine activities are managed by the Principal with the help of the faculty. Necessary policy decisions on matters of planing and development are taken by the Governing Body of the college. Several committees are formed to assist the principal who holds periodic meetings to review the progress and plan academic activities. At present there is no vice principal post in the college. Teachers are required to submit self appraisal reports which are evaluated by the principal. The institution can not provide financial support for various welfare programmes for the faculty for paucity of funds. Teachers and employees of the institution have formed a cooperative society from which they can avail loan. So far only one professional development programme has been organised for non-teaching staff, to improve their work efficiency. The institution has taken initiative to form a grievance redressal cell through which efforts will be made to settle the grievances of the students, faculty and the staff of the college.

The day to day administration of each department is looked after by the concerned Head of the Department who is appointed on the basis of seniority. The departments are not given any separate financial allocation.

The tuition fees of the students are fixed by the Govt. of Assam while the other fees i.e. development fees, building fees, library fees etc. are fixed by the Governing Body of the college. The Bank accounts of the college are operated by the principal who is also the secretary of the Governing Body. The internal audit of the college is conducted annually. Besides, internal audit, there is provision for government audit which is conducted by the Assistance Director of the Local Audits from time to time.

CRITERION - VII: HEALTHY PRACTICE

The institution is sensitized to latest managerial concepts such as strategic Planning, team work, decision making. through the extension education cell of the institution. The institution endeavours to ensure personality development of the students through curricular and various co-curricular programmes.

SUMMARY

The Institution has been playing and important role in promoting higher education in this socio-economically backward region. It has still a long way to go fulfil the aspiration of the community. For this purpose the areas of its strengths and weaknesses have been identified. It has been decided to introduce self financing vocational courses like -Horticulture, Pisciculture etc. to meet up the local demand of this agro-based region. It is also proposed to open full time Computer Courses like - BCA, PGDCA etc. in future to keep pace with the I.T. revolution. Few additional subjects will be introduced. The newly introduced Commerce Stream will be strengthened and developed into a full-fledged stream. The college authority also proposes to introduce science stream in future. Efforts Will be made to strenghten the students feed back system so as to make it more effective. The internal examination mechanism is to be improved further to ensure close monitoring Of students academic standing. Teachers will be encouraged to get involved in research activities. Greater emphasise will be put on learning by doing through seminars, group discussion, field work etc., to suppliment the lecture-method of teaching. Initiative will be taken for computerisation of academic and administrative works of the institution. Development of the college library with all modern facilities is also on its agenda.

It is hoped that with concrete efforts and co-operation from all the stakeholders, the institution will be able to achieve higher efficiency, accountability and quality in all spheres of activitv

ANNEXURE - XVI

Grievence Redressal Cell

A Grievence Redressal Cell has been constituted at Kharupetia College to ensure prompt redressal of grievences of the students, teachers and staff of the college.

Guidelines of Grievence Redressal Cell:

Detailed procedure of settling the grievences are laid down below.

If a student / teacher / employee of the college has any grievence, he / she will report it either verbally or in writing to the concerned Head of the Department. The Head of the Deptt. will enquire into the matter and take necessary action within 3 (three) days if the grievence is found to be genuine. The complainant will be informed of the action taken by the Head of the Deptt. within 3 (days).

If the complainant is not satisfied at the decision of the Head of the Deptt, he/she may move to the Principal. The principal will investigate the matter and will take suitable action within three days.

If the principal's decision / action fails to satisfy the complainant, he / she may approach the Grievance Redressal Cell (G.R.C.). The G.R.C. will verify the grievence and take decision within 3 days.

If the complainant is still not satisfied, he/ she may appeal to the Governing Body (G.B.) of the college. The G.B. will enquire into the matter and take appropriate action within 30 days.

If the decision of G.B. is not satisfactory, the complainant will be at liberty to move to the Director of Higher Education, Assam for redressal of his/ her grievence.

A complaint box has already been installed at the college where the grievences of the students/ teachers / staff may be dropped.

- Rule-1: Name of the fund: The Name of the fund will be Teachers' and Employees' Mutual Benefit Fund, Kharupetia College. (In short TEMBF).
- Rule 2: Eligibility of membership: Any teacher or employee of the college appointed against a sanctioned post on a permanent basis and drawing pay in the Govt. Scale will be eligible to be a member of the fund.
- Rule-3: Loss of membership: Will occur on death of a member, transfer or resignation or discharge and retirement from service.
- Rule-4: Executive Committee: (i) President (ii) Vice President (iii) Secretary (iv)

- Rule 5: Tenure of the Executive Committee: The tenure of the E.C. will be one year. However, if the General Body so desires, the term of the E.C. may be extended for another one year.

Attendance in classes is compulsory. Students failing to attend 75% of the classes held will be treated as non-collegiate and those failing to attend 60% of the classes will not be allowed to appear in the final examination or promoted to next higher class.

General Rules for maintenance of discipline:

The students admitted to this College are expected to maintain high 6. degree of discipline. They must abide by all the rules and regulations as laid down by the College authorities. Violation of those rules, irregular clearance of College Fees, showing discourtesy to the teachers and members of staff in any form, adoption of unfair means in the examination, including in ragging etc. are some of the offences which may lead to disciplinary action like suspension, forced transfer or even expulsion from the College.

The College authority strictly adhers to College examination and promotion rules. Apart from the Final examinations to be conducted by the University, the students of T.D.C. First year class will have to appear in two unit Tests to be held in the month of september and December respectively. Students failing to appears in these unit tests shall not be allowed to sit for the Final Examinations. Such students will have to get admitted to T.D.C. 1st

Similarly, the students of both T.D.C.second year and Third year will have to appear in two unit Tests to be held in the month of september and December respectively.

Appearance in these examinations is compulsory failing which a student will not be sent up to the final examinations. The students of H.S. 1st year and Second year classes are to appear in four unit tests as per schedule to be announced by the A.H.S.E.C. A student unable to appear in an examination on medical ground must submit application along with medical certificate Prior to the examination.

Academic Calendar: 8.

The Academic Calendar of the college is Prepared in accordance with the Academic Calendar of the Gauhati University. Different acdemic and cocurricular activities of the college are carried on according to this Calendar as far as Practicable.

College Library: 9.

The College Library is for the use of the students and teachers of the College. The facilities for birowing of books by students are available subject to abservance of Library rules. Besides the Certral Library, Departmental libraries have also been set up to cater to the needs of the aspiring students.

10. Scholarships:

There is Provision for the following scolarships subject to fulfilment of eligibility criteria.

- National merit Scholarship.
- (ii) State merit Scholarship.
- (iii) Post matric Scholarship for SC/ST/OBC students.

11. Awards:

With a veiw to ensuring quality improvement, the following awards/ incetives have been introduced by various departments from the academic session 2003-2004.

- (1) Cash award of Rs. 500/- (five hundred) each will be given to the students securing highest marks (minimum 50%) in each Major subjects in B.A. Final Examination. If there be no Major student in a particular subject, the award will go to the student securing highest marks (minimum 50%) in that subject offered as general subject. These awards will be sponsored by the respective Departments of the College.
- (2) Late Abdul Wahab Talukdar Memorial Cash award of Rs.500/- (five hundred) will be given to the student securing highest aggregate marks (minimum 60%) in H.S. Final Examination.
- (3) Cash award of Rs. 300/- (three hundred) will be given to the student securing highestaggregate marks (minimum 60%) in H.S. First year Examination.
- (4) Cash award of Rs. 500/- (five hundred) will be given to the student securing highest marks (minimum 50%) in Economics offered as general subject in B.A. Part - I and Part - II Final Examination. These awards will be sponsored by Sri Deepak Kalita and Mrs. Mousumi Kalita, Lecturers, Deptt. of Economics.
- (5) Late Haji Maju Sheikh and Late Abdus Samad Memorial cash incentive of Rs. 500/- (five hundred) each will be given to ten students offering Mathematics as a general subject in T.D.C. classes. The beneficiaries of these incentives will be selected on the basis of a qualifying test to be held by the Deptt. of Mathematics.

12. Students' Aid Fund :

Financial assistance is granted to the poor and needy students out of the Students' Aid Fund which is formed by raising a compulsory contribution from the students of this College. Such assistance is given annually on receiving application from the deserving students subject to availability of funds.

13. Identity cards:

College Identity Card is issued to each student at the time of admission. The students will have to get their Identity Cards renewed every year. In case of loss of this card, a duplicate card may be issued on payment of necessary fine.

Co-curricular Activities: 14.

For all round development of the students, the College provides adequate facilities for various co-curricular activities like indoor, and outdoor games, debate and symposium, cultural programmes etc. Moreover, lectures and seminars on various topics are also organised regularly.

15. Students' Union :

Kharupetia College Students' Union is the general body of the students of the College. All the regular students of the College are the members of this Union. The Principal of the College is the President of the Students' Union. If necessary, the Principal may appoint a Lecturer as the working president. The Vice-president, the General Secretary and other office-bearers of the students' Union are elected by the students annually. The Principal reserves the right to dissolve the Union Body at any time on disciplinary ground and constitute an ad-hoc body till fresh elections are held.

16. College Canteen:

There is a Canteen on Kharupetia College campus. The students, teachers and employees of the College can avail of the services of the College Canteen.

17. Computer Education Centre:

With a view to catering to the need of computer education, a computer Education Centre has been opened at Kharupetia College recently. The centre is run by C-DAC, an affiliated agency under Ministry of Communication and Information and Info Information Technology, Govt. of India. Interested candidates may attend computer classes by paying requisite fees.

Information and Career Counselling Cell:

An Information and Career counselling Cell has been formed at Kharupetia College with the aim of helping the students by providing information about various career opportunities. Interested students and alumni of this College may approach this Cell for necessary information and Career Counselling.



Course world in General Fund, partly and Falchare Dudy. Dollar, June been problem in account in General Fund, partly in and Falchare Dudy. Dollar, June been problem of the 25 724 00 is increased.

As rgards T.A., an expenditure of Rs.25,724.00 is incurred in current 12 months on a/c General Fund, having spent average Rs.2.143.00 per month, which, according to auditors, is excessive.

Also, it may be mentioned that bills for expenditure on account of journeys had been drawn in the shape of "Travelling Allowance". It is suggested that the Account Section of the College would afford to maintain Ledger Account of each Pund and to obseve the principles of book-keeping wholly in future.

And we wish the Kharupetia College be an ideal institution for higher education in the days to come.

Karim has remitted Re-60,000.00 against his liability on a/c of 70% of Tution Foes and the amount so recovered has been shown in Balance Sheet of Tution Fees Fund and kept reserved for Salary Fund.

May it be noted that till end of the present accounting year, Prev. Temporary Loan repayble to Mr. A. Karim, Former Principal i/c, remains outstanding as follows:

With this payment, amount Rs. 30,620.00 is collected so far from Md. Suruzzamal against agreed Lease Money Rs. 51,480.00, hence, there stands a balance Rs. 20,860.00 as at 31st March/03.
- It reveals that no Kist Money on Fishery Lease, has been received in the current year from Lessec Md. Imdadul Islam of village Nagazan. The lease period which commenced on 8.9.2000, will expire on September 7 next. Md. Imdadul Islam remitted Rs. 34,000.00 so far till preceeding year ended 31st March/02 against agreed Lease Money Rs. 5(-,500.00) and an amount of Rs. 16,500.00 remains as outstanding receivable till date of completion of internal audit on 25.7.03.
- Nothing unlike other years, in the current year too there have been caused number of Inter-Fund Transfers which can be seen in Annoxure - IV.

There appeares no express approval by G.B. to such Transfers, except in two case: that Rs. 10,000.00 be transferred from Building Fund and C.D. Fund to General Fund to meet the expenditure for electrification (See Resolution No. 6 meeting dated 13.08.02.)

The G.B. may justify the case.

Observed that Gen. Fund incurs total exponditure Rs. 176719.00 as against gross income Rs. 145012.00, hence, there is a net deficit to the tune of Rs. 31707.00, followed by riet deficits Rs. 10770.00 on a/c Students' Union Fund , Rs. 9702.00 on a/c Games Fund and Rs. 7099.00 on a/c C.M. Fund.

It is necessary that expenditure should not preponderate the strength of

income as far as practicable. G.B. may justify the case.

No. B(2)H.294/2001/4.--In supersession of the Assam Aided College Management Rules, 1976, except in respects of things done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the Governor of Assam is hereby pleased to make the following rules regulating the management of Non-Government Colleges in Assam, namely :-

- 1. Short title, application and commencement :-
 - (1) These rules may be called the Assam Non-Government College Management Rules, 2001.
 - (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
 - (3) They shall be applicable to Non-Government Colleges in Assam affiliated by any Central or State University of Assam and in receipt of deficit Grants-in-Aid or ad-hoc Grants-in-Aid, from the State Government.
- 2. Definitions .-- In these rules, unless there is anything repugrant in the subject or context;
 - (a) "College" means a Non-Government College;
 - (b) "Constitution" means the Constitution of India;
 - (c) "Director" means the Director of Higher Education, Assam;
 - (d) "Governing Body" means the body constituted under rule 3;
 - (e) "Governor" means the Governor of Assam;
 - (f) "Management" means the body or group of persons administering the attairs of a Non-Government College including academic affairs as well as the affairs relating to the assets and liabilities of the Non-Government College in fair manner within the framework of established financial and administrative principles of the State Government from time to time;
 - (g) Non-Government Colleges" means colleges for importing Higher education in the Post-secondary courses, established and situated in Assam, affiliated by any Central or State University of Assam and receiving the concurrence of the State Government;
 - (h) "President" means the President of the Governing Bod
 - (i) "State Government" means the Government of Assam,
 - (j) "Secretary" means the Secretary to the Governing Body;
- Constitution of the Governing Boy :-

Every Non-Government College affiliated to any Central or State University of Assam and duly concurred by the State Government, shall be governed by a Governing Body to be constituted by the Director.

- 4. Composition of the Governing Body :-
 - (1) The Governing Body shall consist of :-
 - (a) One President;
 - (b) One Secretary, the Principal of the College shall be the ex-officio Secretary of the Governing Body:

Provided that if circumstance so demands, the Director may nominate any person from the teaching staff of the college to act as the Secretary in lieu of the Principal of the College, for a period of six months, and beyond that period with the State Government's prior approval.

- (c) The Vice-Principal-Member-Ex-Officio;
- (d) Two members to be nominated by the affiliating University concerned:
- (e) One member to be nominated by the Director from the field of Education:
- (i) One woman member to be nominated by the Director;
- ♦ (g) One member to be nominated by the Director from the Backward Classes;
- (h) Local Deputy Commissioner or his representative may be included as a member;
- (i) Other members as may be nominated by the Director in which the local member of the Legislative Assembly and the Chairman, Zila Parishad may be included;
 - (j) The Governing Body shall co-opt one member from amongst the Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff of the college on the submission of a three persons panel by the Principal. However, they shall have no voting right during discussion of service matters which concern them.
 - (2) The minimum number of members of the Governing Body shall be ten and shall not exceed twelve.
 - (3) Whenever the Governing Body is constituted, the Director of Higher Education shall nominate one member to be the President of the Governing Body.
- 5. Tenure of the Governing Body shall be for a period of three years

 The term of the Governing Body shall be for a period of three years

from the date of its constitution. The term may, however, be extended for another period of two years by the Director with the prior approval of the State Government.:

Provided that if the Director is satisfied at any time that a particular Governing Body is not functioning in the best public interest, the Director may dissolve the Governing Body and constitute a fresh Governing Body thereafter, recording his views with reason thereof through a speaking order for the purpose.

- 6. Taking over the management of a Non-Government College.--In the event of mismanagement of the affairs of a Non-Government College, the State Government may take over the control and management of the College for a period not exceedings six months, and make arrangement for the management of the college in such manner as may be considered necessary and the arrangement so made may be extended for such further period by the State Government as may be deemed necessary.
- 7. Accountability of the Governing Body .-- The Governing Body, consituted under Rule 3 shall be responsible for the proper financial management, including the unkeepment of the assets of the Non-Government College and management of its academic affairs.
- 8. Secretary of the Governing Body to report to the Director .-- The Secretary of the Governing Body shall be responsible to report to the Director about any deviation of financial norms and procedures or any loss of assets of the College immediately whenever it comes to his notice.
- 9. Restriction of some members to attend the Governing Body .-- No member of the Governing Body, being an employee of the College, shall attend any meeting of the Governing Body at which any matter relating to his pay. I romotion or conduct is under discussion. But it shall be open to the Prestaent to call him for making any statement or representation on the subject but he shall have to leave the meeting after doing so, when decision is to be taken.
- 10. Restriction of some members to enter into contract for works of the College -- No member of a Governing Body shall enter into any contract for work, supply of materials or for any sale or purchase with the Governing Body.
- Governing Body.

 11. Disqualifications.-- Any member, who absents himself for more than 4(four) consecutive meetings of the Governing Body, without informing the 4(four) consecutive meetings of the Governing Body and the President, shall cease to be a member of the Governing Body and the Secretary shall report the fact to the Director for record. Further, the Secretary shall report the Governing Body shall be void owing to any to the following grounds:-

- (i) if he becomes insolvent;
- (ii) if by reasons of physical or moral turpitude he becames incapable of acting as such:
- (iii) on death or resignation;
- (iv) on his being convicted of a criminal offence involving moral turpitude.

12. Vacancy in the Governing Body:-

- (1) Any occurence of vacancy in the Governing Body shall be reported by the Secretary forthwith to the Director who shall thereupon take steps to fill up such vacancy in the manner in which it was originally tilled up.
- (2) No act or proceedings of the Governing Body shall be invalid merely because of any vacancy of its members.

13. Meeting of the Governing Body:-

- (1) The Governing Body shall meet at least once in every six months, but it may meet at shorter interval also, if circumstance so demands and the President of the Governing Body is satisfied that such meeting is necessary.
- 2. A meeting of the Governing Body shall be called by the Secretary with the consent of the President, if it is not a requisitioned meeting by the 2/3 (two-third) members of the Governing Body, with not less than 7(seven) days' notice.
- (3) The notice of a meeting shall set forth the business to be transacted at the meeting and no business other than so stated shall be transacted, except with the consent of three-forth of the members present.
- (4. Except any emergency meeting, which shall be so notified, all meetings of Governing Body shall be held in the College permises.

14. Proceedings of the meeting of the Governing Body :-

- (1) The minutes of the proceedings of the meeting shall be recorded in the 'Proceedings Book' by the Secretary and signed by all the
- (2) if any note of dissent is given by any member it shall be recorded in the Proceedings-Book
- 3 All records of the Governing Body shall be kept in the College Office and the Head of the College shall be responsible to preserve all such records properly and safely.

- 15. Presiding over the meeting.= All the meeting of the Governing Body shall be presided over by the President and in the absence of the President, the other members present may select or elect one of them to preside over the meeting already notified and approved before-hand by the President.
- 16. Quorum.-- At least six members of the Governing Body, excluding the Co-opted member, shall form a quorum of the meeting.
- 17. Secretary to make correspondence.- Under the direction of the Governing Body, the Secretary shall make all correspondence with the appropriate authority on behalf of the Governing Body:

Provided that no correspondence shall be made direct to the State Government, but it, however, can be addressed through the Director.

18. Governing Body to obtain prior approval of the Director in certain matters.— The minutes of the proceeding of the Governing Body meeting shall be sent to the Director and the concerned affiliating University. No final decision regarding appointment, promotion, suspension, termination, removal or dismissal of teaching or non-teaching staff including that of the Principal or any construction works involving Rs.50,000/- (Fifty thousand) or more shall be undertaken by the Governing Body without the prior approval of the Director:

Provided that so far as Non-Government Colleges are concerned, the Governing Bodies are not required to send the proceedings of the meeting to the Director but it will be open for the Director to call for the proceedings, if any complaint is received against the Governing Body and any direction given by the Director on it shall be final and binding on the Governing Body of the College.

- 19. Duties of the Governing Body:
 In general the following are earmarked as duties of a Governing
 Body in respect of Non-Governing Colleges receiving deficit
 Grants-m-Aid:
 - to undertake financial management of the College, to utilise the Grants in-Aid received from the State Government, University Grants Commission and any fund collected as authorised Grants Commission and fund received as fees from the students for the subscriptions and fund received as fees from the students for the academic purpose of the Colleges, including payment of salary etc.

- (xi) with the approval of the Governing Body, the Secretary shall utilise the grants for the purpose for which it is sanctioned and submit the Utilisation Certificate to the concerned sanctioning authority in time, with intimation to the Director;
- (xii) the Secretary shall disburse the deficit Grants-in-Aid sanctioned by the Director towards the salary of teaching and non-teaching sanctioned staff of the College within a week from the date of the receipt of the grants;
- (xiii) If any excess amount of Grants-in-Aid is sanctioned towards the salary, the excess amount shall be refunded to the Director by the Secretary immediately.

Grounds of suspension of Grants-in-Aid.-- Failure of submission of annual accounts, report duly signed by the President and the secretary of Governing Body in respect of preceeding financial year, may attract stoppage of Grants-in-Aid by Director suomoto, after the expiry of 30th June, every year:

Provided that on failure in respect of maintenance of a consistent academic achievement by a particular Non-Government College as a whole or a failure to abide by the Government guidelines issued from time to time, or a failure to abide by the Government guidelines issued from time to time, the State Government may instruct the Director to suspend Grants-in-Aid with 30 days' prior notice.

- 21. Other functions of the Governing Body.-- The Governing Body is authorised.-

- (iii) to deal with the discipline and conduct of the teaching and non-teaching staff of the College;
- (iv) to grant fee remission under rules prescribed by the State Government or with the approval of the Director; and
- (v) to deal with the academic calendar within the norms of University Grants Commission and to compel scrupulous compliance of the guidelines in respect of working days and holding of Classes etc.
- 22. Submission of Annual Accounts.-- The Secretary of the Government Body shall ensure submission of Audited Annual Accounts and Annual Administration Report to the Director.
- 23. Interpretation.— If any question arises relating to the interpretation of these Rules, the decision of the State Government shall be final.

CRITERIA FOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME FOR FACULTY

The Institution encourages the faculty for various professional development programme. As per guidelines of UGC it has been made mandatory for the teachers to attend atleast one Orientation Programme and one Refresher Course within six years so to be eligible to be placed in Senior scale. After placemnet in Senior scale a lecturer has to attend atleast two Refresher courses besides fulfilling other conditions to be eligible to be placed in Selection Grade. As the institution does not conduct Professional development Programmes on its own teachers are allowed to participate in such programmes organised by various Academic Staff Colleges under UGC. Generally teachers working against sanctioned posts are given preferential treatment in this regard. The approval of the Governing Body is required to relief the teacher from their duties to enable them to join the Programmes.


